SCIENCE RESEARCH MENTORING PROGRAM (SRMP)

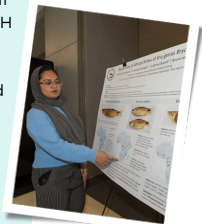
60 students begin with a **4-week Summer Institute** focused on developing skills and understanding of data science, and designed through equity and justice lenses.



All students join AMNH research labs for the academic year and **work with Museum researchers** on projects connected with ongoing research in astrophysics, anthropology, and biology for **260 hours**. Students meet monthly at advisories focused on science communication, equity in STEM, and professional development.



Scholars share their findings with AMNH scientists & educators, their peers, families, and friends through videos, blog posts, and posters in the **June Colloquium** at AMNH.
